Prosthetic Women's Workgroup (PWW) Goals

- Ensure uniformity in the provision of prosthetic appliances across VA
- Eliminate availability concerns
- Provide medically necessary prosthetic devices and medical aids to women Veterans in accordance with federal rules and regulations governing PSAS programs
- Advocate new legislation, changes to existing legislations
- Eliminate barriers to prosthetics care experienced by women Veterans
- Explore contracting and procurement actions that provide devices made specifically for women
- Identify emerging technology for women and propose ideas for research and development
- Change culture and perception of women Veterans through education and information dissemination

Rehabilitation Services for Women as Primary Caregivers

- Rehabilitation is individualized for each Veteran
 - It is a combination of the Veteran's functional deficits and their goals.
 - Goals, roles and responsibilities are discussed, assessed and interventions are provided.
- Women's needs may be addressed differently from men's; e.g., special intervention/programs for women Veterans that are addressed in rehabilitation such as:
 - Breast cancer rehabilitation, pre- and post-pregnancy care, health and wellness, childcare, infant care, feeding and diapering, incontinence, vaginal muscle tone and strengthening, mental health (sexual trauma).

Clothing Allowance

VA must pay an Clothing Allowance to Veterans who have:

- A Service Connected Disability or Condition compensable under 38
 U.S.C. 1151 that
 - requires the Veteran to wear or use a prosthetic or orthopedic device that wears or tears clothing
 - medication prescribed by a physician, which causes irreparable damage to the Veteran's outer garments
- Clothing Allowance may be authorized for Veterans who wear and use:
 - Rigid spinal braces
 - Rigid cervical braces
 - Wheelchairs (Manual)
 - Rigid orthotics and/or ankle and or/foot orthosis (AFO)
 - Ileostomy/Colostomy appliances
 - Skin medications and/or ointments

Clothing Allowance

- As of <u>December 16, 2011</u>, Veterans who meet eligibility the criteria may be eligible to:
 - Receive multiple clothing allowance benefits starting 2012;
 - No retroactive payments are allowed.
- Applications should be received by PSAS no later than July 31st.
- 2013 benefit amount is \$753 per approved clothing allowance

Automobile Adaptive Equipment (AAE)

- Program provides the necessary equipment and training to enable a disabled Veteran or Service member to operate a motor vehicle safely and permit access to and from the vehicle in a safe manner.
- Team effort involves the physician, the driver rehabilitation specialist, and the prosthetic representative.
- Commonly prescribed AAE: cruise control; van lifts; air conditioning; power transfer seat; low effort braking systems.
- VA can reimburse any Veteran for up to 2 vehicles within a 4-year period.
- VBA's Automobile Grant increased in October 2012 to \$19,505.

Home Improvement & Structural Alterations (HISA)

- The HISA benefit provides home improvements and structural alterations necessary only to ensure the continuation of treatment and/or to provide access to the home or to essential lavatory and sanitary facilities (authorized under Title 38(U.S.C.) Section 1717)
 - Lifetime benefit up to **\$6,800** may be provided for:
 - Veterans and Servicemembers who have a Service-connected condition
 - Veteran who have a Non-service-connected condition rated 50% or more service connected
 - Lifetime benefit up to **\$2,000** may be provided for:
 - Non-service-connected Veterans
- Common prescribed HISA items include:
 - Roll in showers or walk in bathtubs
 - Construction of wooden or concrete permanent ramping to provide access to the home
 - Widening doorways to bedrooms, bathrooms, etc to achieve wheelchair access
 - Lowering of kitchen or bathroom counters and sinks, etc.
